Religion and Life

THE REAL REFORMER

A famous British philosopher of our own time found himself unable to accept the teachings of his church. He influenced profoundly the thoughts of his people, but rejected the central doctrines of Christianity. Then he broke out and he was horrified by what men were capable of doing in a fight to the death. This convinced him of the truth of his church's doctrine of human depravity, and he turned back to the faith of his father's as the only remedy. When he died a short time ago, he was in full communion with his church.

It was this that Jeremiah had in mind when he wrote: "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately corrupt." Jeremiah was driven to this truth by deeds as horrible as any in history. In a time of peace Robert Browning was driven to the same conclusion by conditions to which even an optimist could not shut his eyes. After describing one case of unsuspected depravity, he writes: "The candid incline to surmise of that the Christian faith proves false, I find."
 And then adds: "I still, to suppose it true, for See reasons and reasons; this, to begin."
 'Tis the faith that launched point blank her dart.
 At the head of a lie - taught original sin
 The corruption of man's heart."
 It is an old subject and the debates around it are hoary with age, but experience drives us back to the truth that there is something wrong with men which none but God can cure.

The nature of our religion appears in this, that when salvation is offered it begins with the heart. Long before Christ, the prophet Ezekiel had said in the name of God: "A new heart I will give you and a new spirit will I put within you; and I will take out of your flesh the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes." This truth

is taken up in the New Testament and presented in a variety of ways.
 One example is found in Paul's Epistle to the Romans: "Man believes with his heart and so is justified, and he confesses with his lips and so is saved." Salvation is from within. It is the pure in heart who see God. The trust of the heart in Christ means that the man commits to God his real self that the God who created him may create him anew.

The temptation of the ordinary good persons is to try to change life from the outside—to abstain from his indulgence and to practise this or that virtue. Henry Drummond once said that the very earnestness of some young people touched his heart—the care with which they observed certain religious forms and the self-discipline which they exercised day by day.
 We recall in this connection Luther's self-scourging and endless confessions and the Wesleyes with the exactions of the Holy Club.
 Dr. C. W. Gordon, Ralph Connor, once told of a young man whom he tried to help. This youngster had been sent to the Canadian west because his family in England could do nothing with him. He was the slave of drink. Time after time his benefactor would get him straightened up and would find a job for him, but he would break out again and lose everything.
 After months of fruitless endeavor, he forged a number of cheques on the man who tried to help him and skipped out of the country. "Now," said Dr. Gordon, "my mistake was that I didn't strike right at his heart. It was a hopeless struggle to change his habits while his heart was unchanged."
 To all such futile efforts in one's own life, or for others, Henry Drummond's answer was given in these words from the Bible: "We all, with face unveiled, reflecting as a mirror the glory of the Lord, are transformed into the same image from glory to glory, even as from the Lord the Spirit."
 As we look out on the world today the same truth is driven home with tenfold power. It is not merely the horrid cruelty of war, but, with it, senseless humiliations and sufferings inflicted on helpless men by those who have them in their power. It is not enough to raise the standards of living among the nations, good

though that is. A far deeper change is called for, and this throws us back on the grace of God.
 The missionary with his Gospel is the only real reformer. The truth can be established among the nations only by Him Who is the truth. Men must be reconciled to God before they can be reconciled to one another. Jesus Christ is still King of the nations as well as Lord of our lives, and it is only through obedience to Him that the world can enter into peace.
