The wheat yield, in the Province of
Manitoba last year 8,000,000 bushels, is
a million and a half bushels in excess of
that of 1893. The total crop amounts to
nearly a million and a half bushels, or three
million bushels. Twelve thousand cattle
and eight thousand hogs have been raised
for export. The dairy industry has grown,
and two and a half million pounds of butter
has been disposed of. The census
gives the number of farmers and farmers'
sons in Manitoba as less than thirty thou-
sand. It is doubtful if any other agricul-
tural community of such a size can
show so good a record. Though the price
of wheat is low, it is not a matter of sur-
prise that \$800,000 has been spent on agri-
cultural buildings during the year, and
that it is stated that next year the crop area
will be larger than ever.

ATLANTA, Dec. 15.—A number of refugees
from Armenia have arrived here. Ac-
cording to their statements the situation
there is even worse than has been described.
They report that many outrages have been
committed, involving hundreds of pas-
sants, of which no account has hitherto
reached the news centres of Europe. On
the 14th November, Babi Pasha, the
Kurdish governor of Van, devastated the
district of Bani, and massacred all the
villages. The villages of Bonaz, Keren,
and Hezare were razed to the ground, and
many excesses committed. One hundred
and twenty-five Armenian passants were
taken prisoners and tortured and finally
lodged in prison at Van on the ground
that they were insurgents.
