New Whelan Memorial Structure Is Completed

A new Whelan Memorial Building has arisen from the ashes of the old and stands in the business section of the City on Grafton Street.
The new brick structure bears testimony to the enterprise of the members of the Benevolent Irish Society who suffered such a setback in the fire over a year ago. Their then comparatively new quarters were razed to the ground.
The President of the Society is E. W. Hogan. The Patron is Thomas Flynn. Other officers include, Vice-President L. O. Kelly, 2nd Vice-President T. A. McAvinn, Secretary, H. A. Power, Treasurer Pius Callaghan, Sgt.-at-Arms A. McQuaid and Chief Marshal Leo Dowling. Chairman of the Building Committee is John Hogan.
A two storey building, it is stucco trimmed on the exterior and ownership is fittingly displayed by a concrete block inserted over the front centre. The two ground floor areas, fitted with 7 ft 6 inch plate glass windows, and 6 ft 6 inch insets towards the entrance doors, are 16 1-2 ft wide and 40 feet deep with 20 ft square rooms in the rear for storage.
The entire second floor is being occupied by the law firm of Matheson, Peake and Nicholson. It consists of reception room, library, main office and three private offices.
It is interesting to note that the Society is 127 years old. It was incorporated under the laws of Prince Edward Island in 1825. The Society was established in Charlottetown under the patronage of His Excellency Col. John Ready, an Irishman of great distinction who arrived here in 1824 as lieutenant-governor. The building was named in honor of the Hon. Edward Whelan, a former president of the Society and also one of the Father's of Confederation. The County Construction Company erected the building and were the general contractors. Wiring was done by the Redmond Electric while the plumbing and heating was installed by W. L. McKenna and Company. The painting was done by Bernard Callaghan.


