



DERAILMENT AT NORTH WILTSHIRE

A C.N.R. wrecking crew yesterday afternoon and evening finished the job of replacing four derailed cars which left the tracks while attached to Freight Train No. 423 about 2:30 Wednesday afternoon.

The deralement took place a short distance east of North Wiltshire Station but the cars stayed upward for about five hundred feet when two of them went over a low embankment into a field while the other two derailed cars which left the tracks north of the main line.

The train in charge of Conductor William Doyle with Engineer David Pound was the regular afternoon freight on its way to the boat. Three of the derailed cars were tank cars while the fourth was loaded with pulpwood.

A wrecking train in charge of Wilfred Livingstone was dispatched from Charlottetown. The main line was cleared about 9:45 last night. The only delay was a 40 minute holdup to Train 42 coming from the mainland.
