Bronze Cross

Awarded Posthumously

OTTAWA (CP) — Governor-General Vanier, as Chief Scout for Canada, has announced that the Bronze Cross, highest award for heroism in the scouting movement, will be awarded posthumously to Leo Maynard Nickerson of Edmonton.

Mr. Nickerson, a cub master drowned in Lake Wabamun last July 14 in an unsuccessful attempt to save three cubs caught in a sudden storm.

The award list includes the names of 68 members of the scouting movement, some of whom will be invited to Ottawa later this year to receive medals and certificates from the governor-general.

Five scouts and cubs will be given the Silver Cross "for gallantry with considerable risk."

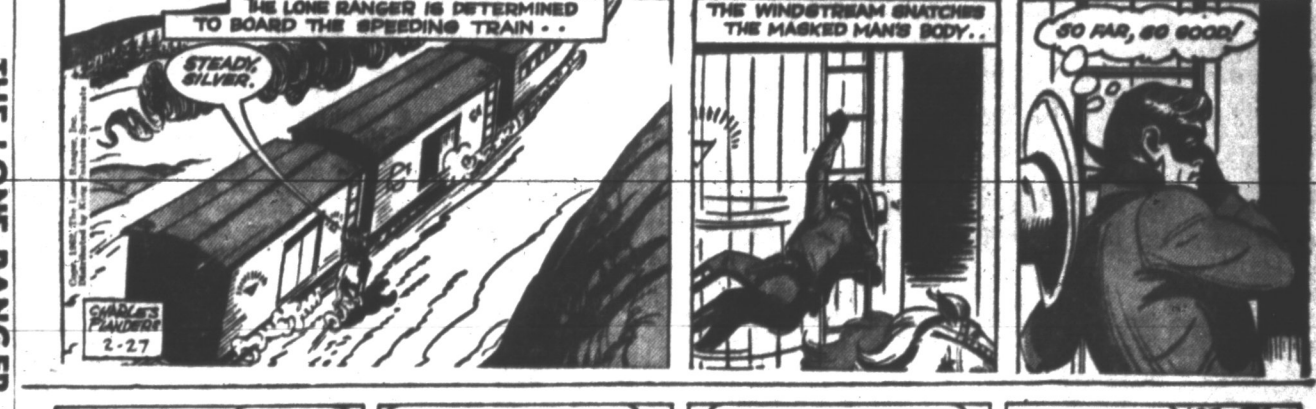
