THE NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION

The aim of NATO Fellowship Programme is to promote study and research leading to publication on aspects relevant to the North Atlantic Alliance. For Scientific and Environ-

mental questions there exist separate programmes, about which information can be had from the Assistant Secretary General for Scientific Affairs, NATO 1110 Brussels. EACH Fellow will be awarded the sum of 23,000 Belgian francs per month (or the equivalent in the currency of any other member state). Grants may be extended from two to four months - to six months. DEADLINE is March 31.

CANADIAN LABOUR CONGRESS

Bursaries for entrance to post-secondary education will be available to assist the children of trade union members in their pursuit of knowledge. Scholarships are made available for students undertaking post graduate

work at a university campus in Canada. The applicant must also be a son or daughter of a member of the trade union. DEADLINES are March 31.

LORD BEAVERBROOK SCHOLARSHIPS IN LAW
