But when it comes to instilling a love of reading worth-while books in their children, the way (it seems to me) lies clear and straight before them. Parents see

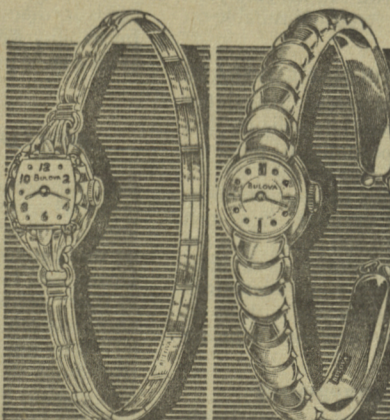
