

CURRENT NOTES.

Germany will shortly sign a customs treaty with Turkey. The Porte has granted Germany valuable concessions.

Cholera has obtained a footing in Italy from Marseilles. It is now reported that Germany is the proposer for arbitration with Spain.

The Ameer will investigate the charges against the Governor at Herat. It is reported that Egypt has ceded the Custom House at Massowah to Italy.

The first Hindoo lady who ever went into trade has opened a bookstore in Bombay.

Col. Robert Bruce, of the Irish Constabulary, has been created a Companion of the Bath.

A terrible thunderstorm in Pisa caused great alarm for the Leaning Tower, but no damage resulted to it.

The Duluth & Northern Railroad Company has been organized to build a railroad from Duluth northward to the Canadian line.

It is estimated that there has been a decrease of about \$3,000,000 in the United States national debt during the month of August.

The Emperor William attended a rifle range on Sunday and fired several shots, besides making an address to the marksmen present.

German competition in coal and cereals continues to weigh heavily on Austrian producers. The stock market has been very quiet.

The conviction appears to be growing that Sir Henry Drummond-Wolf has a most difficult task in arranging matters with Turkey.

Edward Everett Hale reiterates Bulwer's assertion that three hours of daily brain work is ample to get from a man the best that is in him.

The Russian naval manœuvres at Helsingfors will be conducted in absolute secrecy. No foreign attaches will be allowed to witness them.

Spain has got a document, executed three years ago, from the native chiefs of the Carolines acknowledging her sovereignty over the Islands.

The Central Prison investigation Commission have left Hamilton for a tour through the United States, where they will inspect the various prisons.

The Russian Government, besides forcing the Greek Church on the people, is now engaged in suppressing the German language in the Baltic provinces.

The fact that the British Commission refused the Governor of Herat money is alleged as the reason for his presuming to open the Commissioners' letters.

Twenty-five years ago there was not a single newspaper published in Japan. Now that country has more papers than Italy, Spain and Austria, or Spain and Russia combined.

Mine owners in France, Germany, Belgium, and Spain have completed a zinc convention. England and America are now the only countries which the continental producers have to compete with.

The German Government has resolved to make suitable provisions for the widowed sister of the Sultan of Zanzibar. The Berlin Tagblatt says that her son, who is a German, will probably assume a political role in relation to the future of East Africa.

Irish agriculture has progressed during the past year, notwithstanding the depression in trade. The official statistics, which have just been made public, show that there are 5,000,000 acres of land under crops in Ireland, an increase of 81,000 over the acreage of 1884; that there are 10,250,000 acres of grass land, a decrease of 200,000 acres, and that bog, barren and mountain land has decreased 57,000 acres.

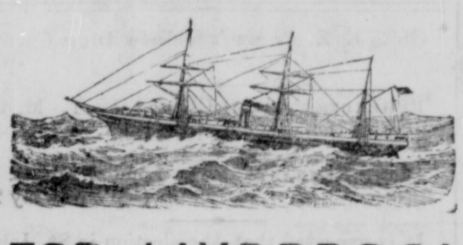
