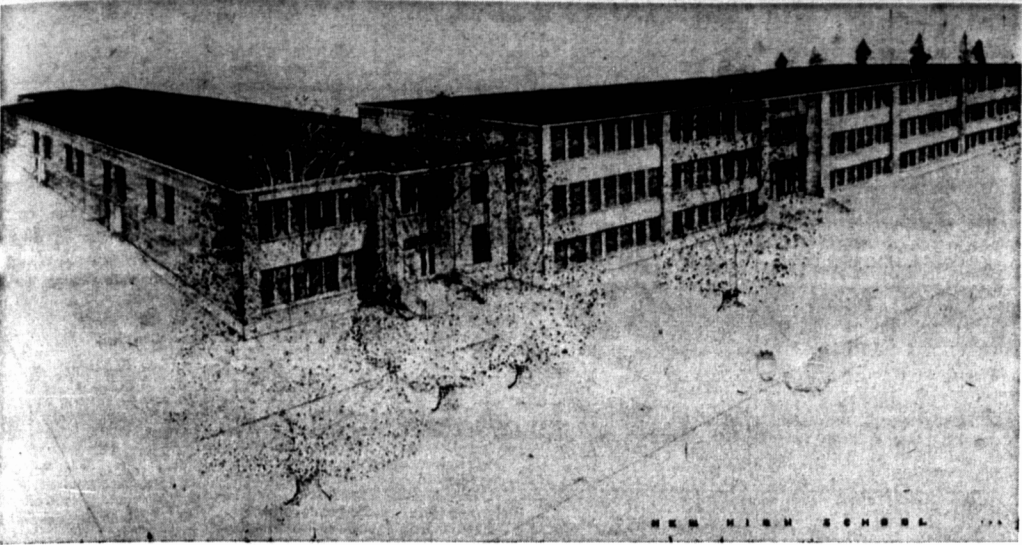

HIGH SCHOOL TO BE COMPLETED BY NEW YEARS

Rapid Progress Being Made On New Ch'town High School

Pictured above is an architect's drawing of the new high school being built in Charlottetown for the City School Board. It is located on the corner of Longworth Avenue and Birchwood Street with the front of the building facing Longworth Avenue. The building is "L" shaped having a frontage of 239 feet 1 inch on Longworth Avenue and a depth of 201 feet 9 inches on Birchwood Street.

Notable features include Acoustic Tile ceilings throughout with either Vinyl Plastic or Jasper Tile floors. The complete building is protected by an Automatic Sprinkler System with double alarms to ring both in the building and in the City Fire Hall. There is an electric time system throughout the building with automatic assembly and dismissal bells. All corridors have Birch Plywood Dado to a four foot height.
