Abandoned Freighter On Rocks Of The Magdalens

SYDNEY (CP)—Crew members of a British freighter abandoned on the rocks off the Magdalen islands told Wednesday how they stuck to their ship until the last minute and then rowed away as waves smashed over her deck.
The 32 men, all uninjured, of the 5,200-ton British freighter Laradore arrived here aboard the salvage tug Foundation Josephine.
Their ship rammaged aground on jagged rocks in a dense fog Saturday but they remained aboard until a heavy westerly gale started to smash their craft to bits Tuesday.
Capt. W. H. Berry of London, England, said "If you go back there today all you'll see is water." A veteran of 42 years at sea, Capt. Berry had high praise for his crew.
"They behaved in the best traditions of the sea," he said.

There was no panic and they carried out every order."
He had special praise for 21-year-old radio operator K. I. Murphy of Cork, Ireland, who remained at his post continuously after the grounding, keeping in touch with the tugs standing by and the Laradore owners.
"We were doing all right until yesterday," said one crew member. "Then the wind switched to the west and the gale hit us hard. She was awash when we left."
The men had planned to make a trip back to the Laradore to take off personal belongings but the heavy seas made it impossible.
For Capt. Berry, it was his first maritime accident. "In 42 years at sea it's the first time I've had my feet wet," he said.
The Laradore was carrying coal from Sydney to Montreal at the time of the crash on Bird rocks off the Magdalen islands in the Gulf of St. Lawrence.
