MONTREAL PROTESTS Gov't To Probe Discrimination

A complete investigation into charges of racial discrimination at North Shore the provincial government, acting premier Andrew MacRae said yesterday.
The Negro family of Montreal physician, Dr. James A. Phils, last week was turned away from Gregors-by-the-Sea, a north shore resort, managed by Jack Canvor. Dr. Phils complained to this newspaper.
In addition an informed source told The Guardian - Patriot that racial discrimination is general throughout the North Shore, extending not only to Negroes, but also to Jews and French Canadians.
"The whole matter will be discussed at Thursday's Executive Council meeting," Mr. MacRae said. He added that a Tourist Development Minister, J. David Stewart, is making an investigation and will report on his findings to the cabinet.
Meanwhile the news of the alleged discrimination involving Dr. Phils, has brought a telegram from Montreal City Council expressing shock at the reports in Montreal papers of dis-

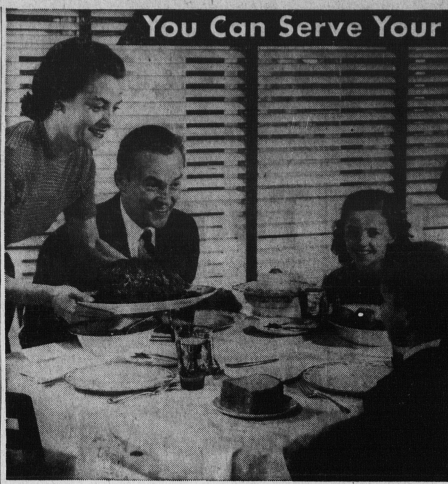
