LONDON, Ont. (CP)—A newspaper's right of access to city council documents in Ontario cities will be tested in a court hearing here today. Mr. Justice J. McLennan of the Ontario Supreme Court will hear an application from Arthur R. Ford, editor-in-chief of the London Free Press, for two court orders against the City of London. One application seeks right to inspect minutes of a meeting of an annexation committee of the city and an annexation report prepared by Project Planning Associates of Toronto. The other seeks that he be given copies of the documents. Both applications are made under the provisions of the Ontario Municipal Act which Mr. Ford says he believes gives a person the right to inspect and receive copies of proceedings of a city council and documents in its possession.
