A committee are waiting on the candidates today.

—Major Clarke and Mr. J. A. J. McKenna, the Government Commissioners investigating the Indians of the Northwest, were banqueted at Alberta recently. Both gentlemen acknowledged in a fitting way the honor done them, and the banquet is described as a great success. Mr. McKenna is a native of Charlottetown.

—Pte. John Harris, of the R. C. R., who, it will be remembered was wounded at the battle of Paardeburg on the morning of Cronje's surrender left today for Montreal where he will undergo an operation with a view to saving his arm. He is accompanied by Dr. Alley who has taken much interest in this unfortunate young man, and done all in his power for him. Dr. Alley has great hopes as to the success of the operation, which is to be performed in the Montreal General Hospital.

—Two large new plate glass windows are to be placed in the Charlottetown office of the Merchants' Bank of Halifax as soon as possible. Other improvements are to follow, such as the putting down of hardwood floors and the placing of a new counter. After the first of the year the name of the bank will be changed to the "Royal Bank of Canada" and new notes issued. The old notes will be called in. The glass was to have been put in place today, but when the package was opened it was found to be broken.
