Each of us may advance half-way to meet the other." The Comte de Chambord read the letter thoughtfully, then rose and said to the envoy who had brought it: "If his Majesty the Emperor comes to see me in my house he will be cordially and royally entertained; but I cannot go out of my house to meet him. It would," he added, resuming his seat, "be against tradition for a King of France to go out of his way for any other sovereign."
