

Local and Other Items.

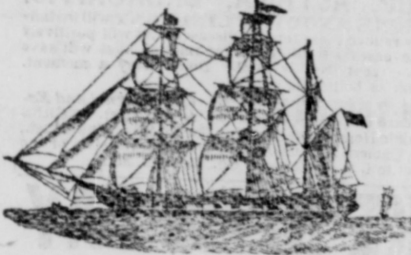

KINNON, formerly of this Island, and now of 10 Short Street, Gloucester, was naturalized an American citizen on Friday last in Boston, Mass. A YOUNG men's prayer meeting will be held this evening, beginning at 8 o'clock, in the parlour of the Y. M. C. Association. The young men are cordially invited to attend. THE REV. DR. BURNS, has been elected Moderator of the Presbyterian Synod. He was opposed by the Rev. Thomas Sedgwick, and the vote stood forty-three for Dr. Burns and forty-one for Mr. Sedgwick. THE subscribers of the Prince Edward Island Hospital will hold a meeting in St. Paul's Schoolroom this evening, to begin at 7.30 p.m. The object of the meeting is to appoint Trustees, and take action upon the report of the Committees on by-laws, and Hospital premises. THE instruments formerly used by the St. Patrick's Band having been presented to St. Joseph's and St. Ann's Convents, in this city, were sold for the benefit of those institutions on Saturday last. They were purchased by the committee of the 82nd Battalion, and will very likely replace some of the instruments in the Band of that Battalion.—Herald. THE City Council intend presenting an address of welcome to Captain Davies tomorrow at eleven o'clock. Hon. W. W. Sullivan has kindly given the use of the Legislative Library to enable the Council, in a fitting manner, to offer their tribute of regard to Commander Davies. The public are invited to attend. A report was in circulation at Halifax, Saturday evening that Warren Smith, as well as the other members of the crew of his father-in-law's vessel, who have been missing since the gale of August 29th, had been rescued. It was stated that the men were picked up by a Norwegian vessel and carried to a South American port, but the rumor could not be traced to a reliable source. CATTLE AND SHEEP EXPORTATION.—Messrs. Wood, George and Humphrey, of Sackville, shipped 150 cattle and 320 sheep to England on Saturday last. They lost quite largely on their trial shipment of sheep, a few weeks ago, by reason of their not being good enough for the market. It is not creditable to our farmers, many of whose lands are well adapted for sheep raising, that the company had to make its purchases in P. E. I. for the recent shipment.—Amherst Gazette. Government of Canada Loan for \$4,000,000, 4 per cent. Currency Bonds.

THE Minister of Finance for the Dominion of Canada, is authorized to receive tenders for a loan of \$4,000,000 currency bonds, bearing interest from the 1st November, 1883 at the rate of 4 per centum per annum, payable half yearly on the 1st May and 1st November of each year, at his office, in the Finance Department, Ottawa.

This loan is issued under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada, passed during their last Session, (46th Victoria, cap. 3, sec. 4.)

The object of the loan is to provide for the payments of debts maturing or redeemable in the course of the current fiscal year, and partly for expenditure on public works.

The principal of the loan now offered is to be repaid at Ottawa in twenty years.

Subscribers will receive bonds to bearer, which may at any future time be converted into registered stock.
