IN MEMORIAM
MRS. BERNARD MCKENNA

There passed to her eternal reward on June 3 after an illness of three days Mrs. Bernard McKenna (nee Bridget Duffy of Scotch Fort) The deceased was born in the town of Monaghan Ireland, in 1824, and emigrated to Prince Edward Island in the Ship Lady Consable in 1847.

She lived with her parents at South Rustico until her marriage in 1850. She was the mother of twelve children, six of whom predeceased her. Since the death of her husband she resided at the old homestead under the tender care of her son Joseph and his wife. Her's was a life of labour and sacrifice, a true pioneer giving of her best that others might live.

The funeral was largely attended the Requiem Mass being sung by her pastor Rev. J. B. MacIntyre; Revs. W. D. MacGuigan and Rev. James Murphy were in the Sanctuary. After Mass she was laid to rest in the Cemetery adjoining St. Bonaventure Church. May She rest in Peace.
