In the Wilderness, the Israelites find fault with Moses and complain of God's care. Angry, God sends too much manna at one time and smites them with a plague. Many die—Numbers 11.

Even Aaron and Miriam, Moses' brother and sister, resent his authority. God afflicts Miriam with leprosy. When Aaron repeats, Moses prays for a cure. She is made well—Numbers 12.

Moses sends 12 spies, one from each tribe, to scout the Promised Land. Two return urging invasion; the giving false reports, are believed. The Israelites refuse to enter Canaan—Numbers 13.

In His anger, God denies the Israelites entrance to Canaan. They invade without His blessing, are defeated, and wander 40 years in the Wilderness—Numbers 14.

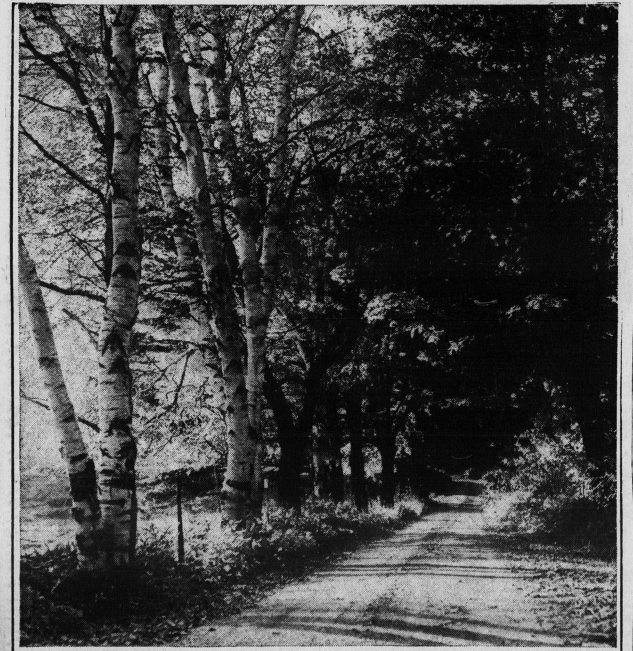
