

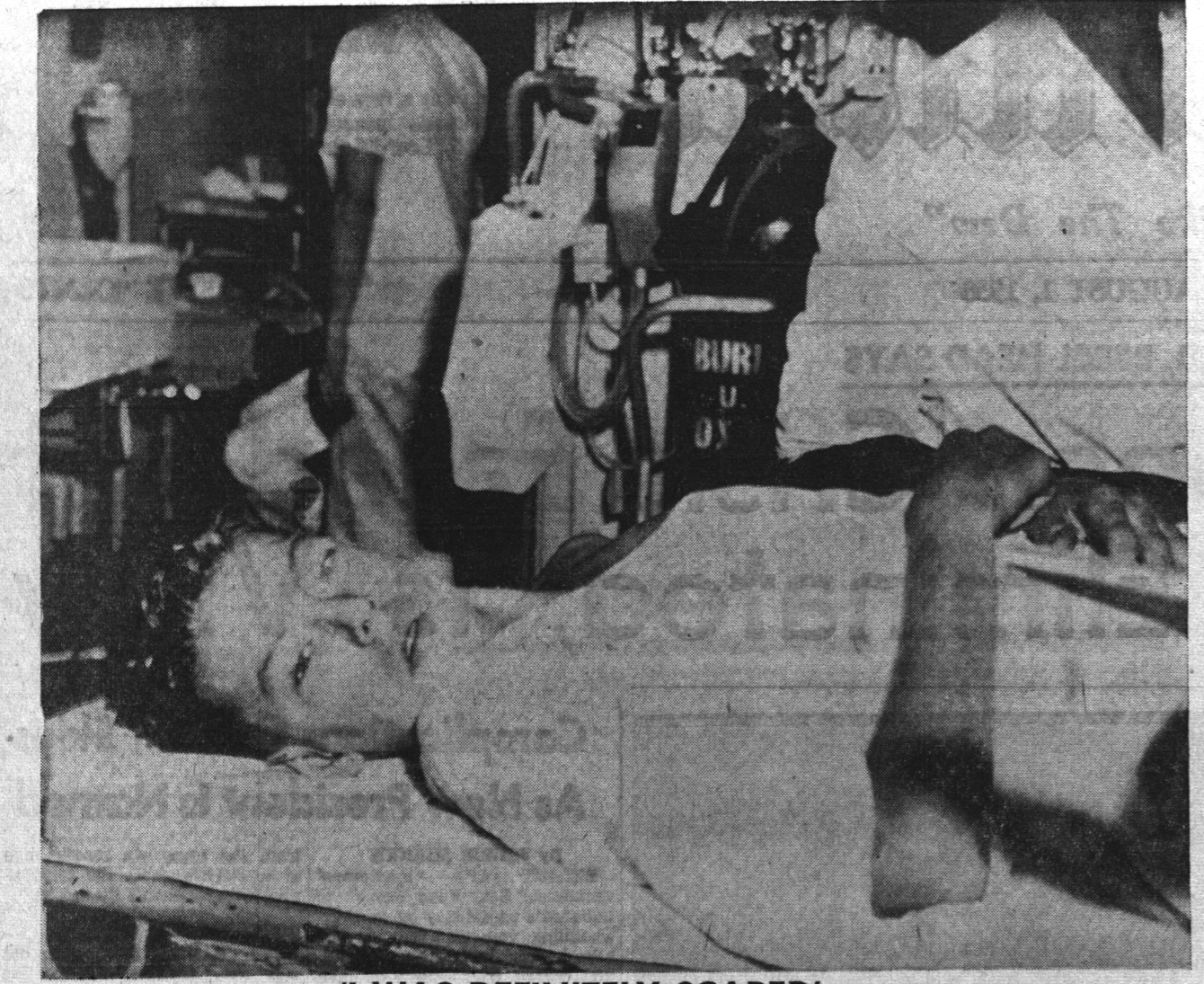
WEATHER

Justice Minister Fulton has sent letters to all provincial attorneys-general inviting them to a meeting here sometime between Sept. 16 and Oct. 16 to discuss the proposed changes.
