**A Strategic Position.**  
THE BOUNDARY BETWEEN RUSSIA AND THE TURKISH DOMINIONS.

The strategic position of Gilgit is exceedingly important, says a London journal. From Gilgit to the Oxus the distance is in a straight line is about 230 miles. The intervening country is divided by the Hindoo Koosh range, between the northern slopes of which and the Oxus lies Afghan Turkestan. Roughly speaking, the river has been generally regarded as the boundary between the Russian territory—that is to say, Russian Turkestan—and the Ameer's dominions. But the Russian military geographers and ethnographers have constantly been dwelling on the fact of community of race between the population on the northern bank and those on the southern as an argument for the extension of Russian authority southward and up to the northern slopes of the Hindoo Koosh. It does not seem to have occurred to them that, as a mere matter of logic, the argument might have come with equal propriety from the Ameer. To cut a long and complicated story short, the object of all these obscure movements on the Oxus and among the passes of the Pamir is to push the Russian boundary, sooner or later, as far as the Hindoo Koosh. Afghan Turkestan is, perhaps, richer than any portion of the Ameer's dominions. The situation is complicated by tribal disturbances within Afghanistan proper. We refer to the Hazara tribesmen, who occupy a considerable extent of territory between the Kabul and Herat districts, and who have never been conspicuously loyal to the Ameer. If British diplomacy can secure peace and stability in the Afghan dominions, General Lord Roberts is certainly the man who may most confidently undertake the task. As all the world knows, he is a great soldier—perhaps the best whom India, that nursery of soldiers, has produced in these latter days, but he is, besides, a diplomatist of rare tact and skill. A Simla despatch says the Ameer of Afghanistan is so busy endeavoring to suppress the revolt among the Hazaras that he has no time to defend his territory in the Pamir against the Russians. Fearing they will seize upon the part of the Pamir region that belongs to Afghanistan, the Ameer has asked the government of India to intervene to prevent Russian aggression in the Pamir country. It is believed at Simla that the Russians mean to seize upon the Pamir, and that the movement to take possession of the country has been timed with reference to political factors in Central Asia and Western Europe, the military troubles and confusion in Afghanistan, where the Ameer seems to be unable to restore order, and the believed disorder of the political situation in England. It is thought that Russia's object is to first assert her right to Shingai by occupying it and driving out the Afghans who have taken possession of the place, and to turn the Chinese position in Kashgar, Russia, for some reason, seems to make no calculation upon the Chinese opposition to her plans. The Indian government's reply to the Ameer's request is anxiously looked for.

**Eastward Record Broken**  
STEAMSHIP CITY OF NEW YORK WINS NEW HONORS FOR THE INMAN LINE.

A New York despatch of the 23rd says: The fastest run from Queenstown to Sandy Hook was finished by the Inman line steamship City of Paris on June 27, her time being 5 days 15 hours and 58 min. She thus beat the best westward trip of the Teutonic by 33 minutes. Under the prestige of a prospective Yankee register, the City of New York added to the laurels of the Inman line yesterday by completing at Queenstown the fastest eastward run on record. Her time was 5 days 19 hours and 57 minutes, which is one hour and six minutes better than the best previous trip to Queenstown, made by the Teutonic last October.

The City of New York passed the red lights of Sandy Hook at 3 o'clock last Wednesday afternoon. She had steamed up to noon on Thursday 394 knots. Between noon on Thursday and noon on Friday, the nautical day, which is a little more than 23 hours going eastward, she logged 467 knots. This speed on the day (nearly 25 hours) going westward would be equal to a trifle more than 500 knots. At noon on Saturday the ship had covered 474 more knots. The runs for Sunday, Monday and Tuesday were, respectively, 460, 475 and 468 knots.

**Nancy Hanks.**  
THE CAREER OF THE NEW QUEEN OF THE TURF.

Nancy Hanks, the new queen of the trotting turf, like many of the trotting celebrities in the past, is a small-sized animal, not exceeding 15 hands in height. She is a dark bay, and a trifle angular in her general outline.

It has been stated by those who have examined her that Nancy is somewhat calloped, and has a peculiar habit of crossing her hind legs when walking. She is one of the most thoroughly honest, reliable trotters that has ever appeared upon the turf, however, and her career has been marked by such a succession of brilliant victories as has never fallen to the lot of any other trotter of her age. Nancy's first appearance in a public race was at Harrodsburg, Ky., July 31, 1889, where she met Bonny Wilmore, Abbey V. Twist, Catherine Leyburn, Minnie Moore and Mattie H. The first heat was won by Bonny Wilmore in 2 27 1/2, after which Nancy Hanks led at the wire in 2 27 1/2, 2 25 1/2, 2 25 1/2. The above is the only heat that she has ever lost. She was in all seven races that year, and closed the season with a record of 2 24.

In 1890 Nancy Hanks won six races, the most notable of which was at Lexington, Ky., August 23, where she defeated Bonny Wilmore and Mattie H. in 2 19 1/2, 2 14 1/2. The third heat was the fastest ever made by a four-year-old trotter in a race. Last season Nancy fully maintained the great reputation for speed, pluck and endurance that she gained in her four-year-old form. She won at Pittsburg, Detroit, Buffalo and Chicago. August 27, 1891, she met the wonderful trotting stallion Allerton at Independence, Ia., and defeated him, though the son of Jay Bird forced her to go the fastest race ever trotted. The time of the heats was 2 12, 2 12 1/2, 2 12.

August 24, 1891, Nancy was started at Cambridge City, Ind., to beat her record. She was accompanied by a runner, the latter going to saddle. She trotted the mile in 2 09 1/2. The time by quarters was 0 32 1/2, 0 31 1/2, 0 32, 0 33 1/2. The runner, who was to encourage her, on the last quarter met with an accident, and she finished the mile alone.

Nancy Hanks is the property of Mr. J. Malcolm Forbes, the well-known Boston yachtsman, who bought her at the reported price of \$40,000.
