New Labor Union Signs Agreement

CORNER BROOK, Nfld. (CP)—The independent Newfoundland Brotherhood of Woods-Workers, organized during recent labor unrest in the province, Friday signed an interim agreement with Bowater's Newfoundland Pulp and Paper Mills Limited here.

The contract was similar to one signed last month between the NBWW and the Anglo-Newfoundland Development Company at Grand Falls.

Bowater's mill manager Albert Martin and union president Max Friday signed the interim contract Friday which they said would be ratified in full April 30.

Mr. Martin said the agreement "will do a lot of good for the loggers, our own company, the industry and all of Newfoundland."

Mr. Lane said "we shall do the best we can to build up the organization as fair, unbiased, truthful while putting Newfoundland first."

At the same time, lawyer Leonard Martin signed for 44 of some 60 Bowater contractors. Mr. Martin, who represents the Newfoundland Contractors Association, said he has received "verbal assent" from the other contractors they will join the union.

Mr. Lane claims the NBWW now has more than 3,000 members from the Bowater area of western Newfoundland and 9,000 throughout the province. The western area previously was a stronghold of the International Woodworkers of America (IWA) which struck the A.N.D. Company Dec. 31.

The strike was punctuated with violence and resulted in the death of a policeman during a riot.

DECERTIFYING UNION
Mr. Smallwood pushed through legislation decertifying the IWA while personally leading a campaign to organize the new union for the province's loggers.

The new agreement with Bowater's provides a wage increase of five cents an hour for all hourly-rated woods employees and an equal increase for salaried employees.

It boosts the average cutting rate per cord to \$7.22 from \$7.13. The agreement also calls for recognition of the union as the sole agency for collective bargaining for loggers; the deduction of union dues on written assignment and the setting up of a union-management committee.

Prices of Gas, Diesel Fuels, Are Increased

TORONTO (CP)—Imperial Oil Limited and the British-American Oil Company Saturday announced price increases for motor gasoline and diesel fuels.

The wholesale prices of all grades of gasoline are increased 2-10ths of a cent per gallon and diesel fuel 1-10th of a cent.

Spokesmen for the firms said the move reflects increased sales taxes announced in Thursday's federal budget. The new prices are uniform across Canada.
