Envoys Confer With Belgian Prime Minister

BRUSSELS, Aug. 29.—(Tuesday) (CP)—Reports of a new move to mediate the German-Poland dispute were circulated here early today at Prime Minister Hubert Pierlot received in quick succession last night the ambassadors of Great Britain, France, Italy, and Germany and the ministers of Poland and Hungary.

Hitler Receives Britain's Answer

No Immediate Indication Of Reaction In Berlin — Fuehrer Believed Adamant

'Showdown' Note Shifts Scene To Berlin For Move

Official Silence Maintained Over Latest Message To Hitler—Believed Aimed To End Uncertainties

LONDON, Aug. 29.—(Tuesday)—(CP)—Great Britain's "showdown" message to Fuehrer Hitler was said authoritatively today to contain a flat warning that a German threat to Polish independence would find Great Britain and France "fighting from the first day on the side of Poland."

Strictest silence was maintained about other angles of the communication handed the German leader in Berlin last night by the British Ambassador, Sir Neville Henderson.

Its general tone was described in usually reliable quarters, however, as aimed at putting a definite end to European uncertainties—preferably by negotiation, but by war if Hitler should choose that course.

Inquest Held Into Death Of Indian
