### COCOANUT BARS

1 1/2 cup Crisco  
1 cup sugar  
2 egg yolks  
1/2 tsp. milk  
1/4 tsp. vanilla  
1 tsp. baking powder  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1 1/4 cups flour  
Pack in pan and add topping.  
2 egg whites  
1 cup brown sugar  
2-3 cup cocoanut  
1/2 tsp. vanilla  
Beat egg whites stiff and add sugar, etc. Bake in oven at 350 degrees from 30 to 45 minutes.
