J., June 18—(AP)—Sydney Wooderson's long-heralded invasion of United States running fields ended on a sour note Saturday when the little Briton was bumped and half-tripped in the final lap of the Princeton invitation mile, and, far from setting a new world record, finished last in a slow field of five.
