

# RAPE: THE MOST DEVASTATING CRIME

CHICAGO (NDS-CUP) -- Data gathered for a new study on the effects of rape may demonstrate just how strongly victims of rape are affected by their ordeal.

The study conducted for the Chicago-Cook County Criminal Justice Commission is a compilation of data gathered on nearly 3,000 rape victims across the country. The study found that rape victims are far more likely than other crime victims to move, change jobs, or carry a weapon for self-defense.

Nearly half of all victims surveyed in Milwaukee, for example, moved after the incident compared to moves by only 25 per cent of the victims of other violent crimes.

One-third of the rape victims began to carry

weapons for self-defense, whereas only half that number began to carry weapons after being victimized by other violent crimes.

And after being raped, one-fourth of the Milwaukee victims changed their jobs, while no victims of aggravated assault did so. The study recommended more counselling service for rape victims and their families.
