



A VIEW from the south of the new Charlottetown Regional High School, where one of the third-storey walls collapsed yesterday shows some extent of the damage. Workmen were preparing to put in the ceiling steel just before the accident, in which two men were hurt. It was suggested that if the steel had been in place the wall would have held under the wind pressure which supposedly caused the collapse. Damage is estimated at \$200,000 to \$300,000, and there are fears that the school, as a result of the accident, will not be ready for the fall term.

School Wall Collapses; 2 Men Injured Slightly

Two men were "slightly" injured yesterday afternoon when a third-storey section of the Charlottetown Regional High School, now under construction, collapsed.

Work had been proceeding with all possible speed in an effort to complete the fall session in time for the fall sessions of school. M.F. Schurman is contractor for the building.

The two men were identified by a company official as Frank MacDonald and Frank Powell, both of Charlottetown.

NO COMMENT

Company officials would make no comment on the cause of the accident.

Apparently, however, it has been attributed to wind pressure. The contractor had not had a chance to get the third floor ceiling steel into place, and the "green" cement holding the building blocks together was unable to withstand the wind.

First-hand accounts say that almost all the south section steel, where the accident occurred, had warped, collapsed, or been thrown out of place. One entire section under the collapsing wall fell through to the next floor.

OPENING DELAYED

The ceiling steel apparently was going to be erected shortly after the accident actually occurred. A gang of workmen was preparing to start the work, but had not at that time entered the building.

National Park Announces Additions, Improvements
