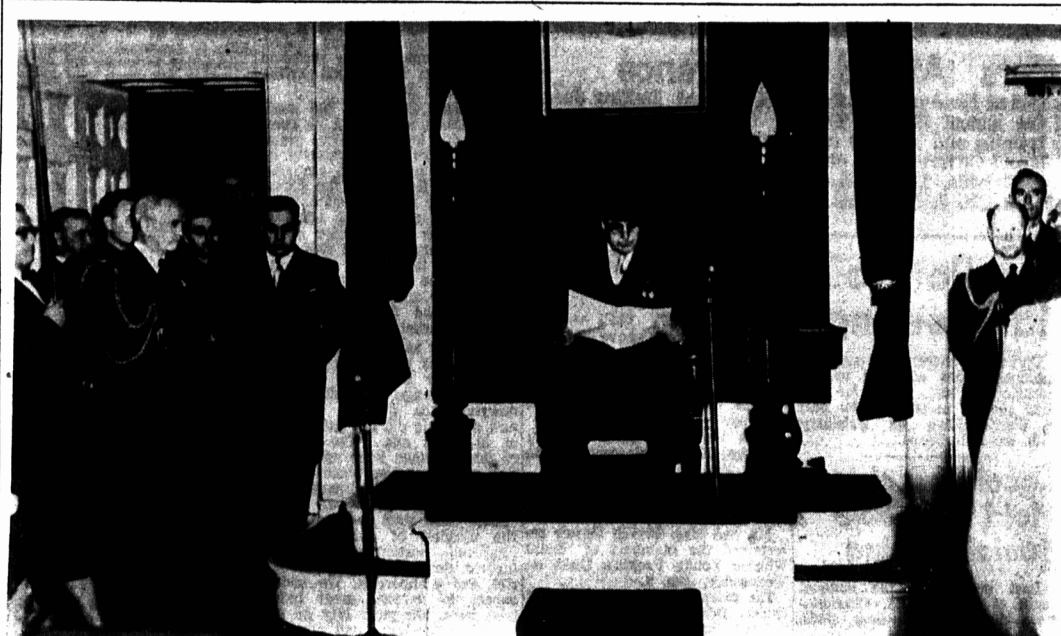

By Richard Kasishko MOSCOW, (AP)—Georgi Malenkov's resignation from the Soviet premiership likely will mean a substantial reshuffle of the whole Soviet government under the eye of Nikita S. Khrushchev, Westerners in Moscow believed Tuesday.



Malenkov stepped down Tuesday with a confession of failure to do his job. To succeed him Khrushchev nominated Nikolai Bulganin, defence minister and an army marshal, as the choice of the Communist party's central committee which Khrushchev leads.
