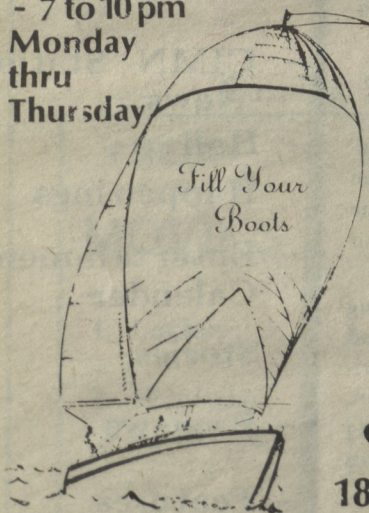

GREAT was the surprise and sorrow throughout the British Dominions when the cables flashed far and wide on the night of May 6th, the doleful message that Edward, England's King had suddenly passed away.
