POLIO IMMUNIZATION Clinics conducted by the Health Department will be held in most of the rural schools during the next three weeks, or in regional centres. These are for first and second polio inoculations for children born before 1955 up to pupils in Grade X, also for expectant mothers. These latter must present a doctor's certificate confirming pregnancy when reporting for a first inoculation. Teachers will have information about dates and times of clinics. A re-inoculating inoculation for diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus will be given for infants and vaccination against smallpox.
