

Greetings From Mayor Yeo To Citizens Of Montague

Mayor Bruce Yeo yesterday, on behalf of the Town Council extended greetings and best wishes for a bright and prosperous New Year to the people of Montague.

His Worship reviewed some of the accomplishments of the past year, and looked forward to still greater progress in the year just dawning.

Among the projects cited by Mayor Yeo was the street paving program which this year was extended to complete Queen Street, Central Street, MacDonald Street and a part of Sackville Street, together with pavement on the street in front of the new Nurses Residence and a re-coat on existing streets. His Worship stated that all major community facilities had been kept in constant repair or were improved. He noted the ever-growing improvement of fire-fighting facilities in the Town, and assured the citizens that this department would always receive the highest consideration so that the citizens of the community would have the best possible protection.

Mayor Yeo outlined the sanitation program which he said left little to be desired as every precaution for adequate sanitation was being taken. He also reviewed the Town finances stating that he considered them to be in an enviable position which also reflected to the responsibility of the citizens who were not hesitant to meet their obligations to the Town. He also outlined the new sidewalk program, explaining that a portion had already been undertaken.

This portion, he said, was held



over at this time owing to the late completion of the season, but would be completed in the spring. At the same time a further program of sidewalk construction would also be undertaken.

Mayor Yeo noted with pride the new buildings in the Town, the federal building, the nurses residence, the Federal Warehouse, the many new residences and also the new concrete bridge, all of which he concluded, was significant evidence of the growth and progress of the Town. He felt assured that the year 1955 would see equally important steps marking the progress of this community.
