(standard time) daily. Trains leave Charlottetown for the East at 6 a. m. and 1.10 p. m. (standard time) daily. Trains leave Georgetown for the West at 7 a. m. and 2.40 p. m. (standard time) daily. Trains leave Souris for the West at 6.15 a. m. and 1.20 p. m. (standard time) daily. One of the P. E. 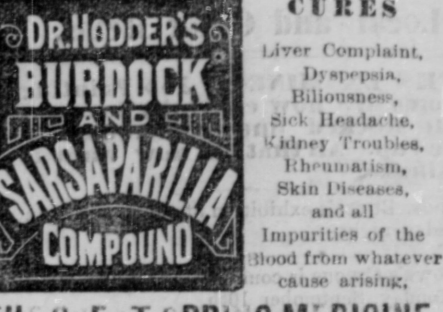
