

Household Hints.

Celery sauce is easily made, and is appetizing. Cut the celery in small pieces, and boil until it is tender; then add a half pint of cream, salt and pepper, and a small lump of butter rolled in flour; let these all just boil; spice or a small pinch of curry powder may be added if you choose.

These cooks who do not like the flavor of olive oil, or who cannot afford to use it for frying purposes, can clarify butter without any difficulty so that it will answer every requirement. Put the butter in a clean sauceman over a slow fire when it is melted skim off the buttermilk, if there is any; let the melted butter stand for a minute or two, though not long enough for to cool; then pour through a fine sieve or a thin muslin cloth.

Carrots prepared in this way make a good side dish or entree. Scrape and wash them; boil until tender, in as little water as will serve to keep them covered; put in a large pinch of salt; when the carrots can be easily pierced with a broom splint, drain of the water and roll the carrots in flour; put a lump of butter in the sauceman and set on the stove; when hot put the carrots in and fry until brown; the carrots may be cut in two parts or cooked whole; turn them so that they will brown on all sides.

TERMS OF UNION.
SECTION 7.—That the Dominion Government shall assume and defray all the charges for the following services, viz:
SUB-SECTION J.—Efficient steam service for the conveyance of mails and passengers to be established and maintained between the Island and the mainland of the Dominion, winter and summer, thus placing the Island in continuous communication with the Inter-colonial Railway, and the Railway system of the Dominion.

As heretofore, THE EXAMINER will, in 1882, advocate the introduction of improvements calculated to advance the interests of Prince Edward Island, in particular, and the great Dominion of which we form a part, in general.

THE EXAMINER is in favor of cutting down the Local Legislature, consolidating the Local Civil Service on a sound business basis, maintaining a system of rigid economy in the administration of local affairs, and applying the money thus saved to the advancement of the Agricultural and Industrial interests of the Province.

THE EXAMINER'S policy shall be, as it has been, first National and then Political; first for the Island, next for Canada, and then for the Party by which both are governed.

Articles on Practical Agriculture will form a prominent feature of THE EXAMINER during 1882; and our columns will, as heretofore, be well filled with news and interesting miscellany.
