New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP) - The stock market reversed itself Tuesday and declined under the weight of moderate selling in the final hour. Losses never were great and amounted to 2 points at the outside in key areas. Plus signs, on the other hand, went to around 3 points.

Aircrafts were the main prop for prices. Strength in that division followed a vote by the senate appropriations committee to boost U.S. air force funds \$700,000,000. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was down 60 cents at \$169.60. It was up \$1 Monday at \$170.60.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP) - Buoyant paper, utility and base metal sections spearheaded an industrial climb to higher ground at the close of active trading on the stock market Tuesday.

International Power advanced 3 points to 150 in a 15 share turnover. Quebec Power jumped 2 1/2 to 33. Morgan 2 1/2 to 22. Bathurst B. 1 1/2 to 49 1/2 and McGill, 1 1/2 to a new top of 40 1/2. Southern Canada Power, at 52, aluminum at 102 and Canadian Oil at 23, were each a point improved.

Shawinigan slumped 3 points to 64 and General Dynamics, a point to 61 in light trade while Walker fell 7 1/2 to 71.

Mines were irregularly higher. Pronto rose 40 cents. Quebec Nickel, 28 cents. Sullivan and United Asbestos, each 20 cents. Pardee, 17 cents and Sherrill, 15 cents. Rayrock fell 20 cents to \$4.60 while Canadian Lithium lost 10 cents at \$1.70.

Western oils moved narrowly higher in moderate trade. Industrial volume was 116,100 shares and mines, 702,700.

Of the 315 issues traded, 123 were up, 75 down and 117 unchanged, with 48 new highs and 7 new lows established for the year. The stock exchange's closing average shows banks up 0.97 at 47.17, utilities up 1.15 at a new high of 135.0, industrials up 0.8 at 286.6, combined up 1.0 at a new high of 236.0, papers up 0.72 at a new high of 145.95 and goods up 0.90 at 83.84.
