The Emperor of China has ratified the "Pekin treaty," or treaty of peace, with France. The Quebec Chronicle says: Two inches of snow fell a couple of days ago at St. Honore, County of Temiscouata. A new insect is ravaging vineyards in Roumania and Bessarabia. Vineyards have been sent to make investigation. The amount of the temporary loans obtained by the Government in Canada is \$4,000,000, and in England \$11,419,000. Persian papers state that the Ameer is about to make a tour of Afghanistan, and will meet the Khan of Bokhara at Balkh. Princess Beatrice is two inches taller than the Queen, with a form so perfect that it is said art can add no beauty to its outline. It costs about \$40,000,000 annually to govern the city and county of New York—more than \$36 to each man, woman and child. It is reported that England and Germany have arrived at an agreement in regard to their rights on the Benue and Niger rivers similar to the St. Lucia agreement. Three-quarters of the town of Grodno, in Russia, including the government offices and numerous churches has been burned. The loss amounts to several million roubles. Fires have been discovered on two different British war vessels at Bermuda, recently, and the authorities are said to ascribe them both to the agency of dynamiters. The Colonial Union has decided to establish a number of trading stations along the upper Benue River, in Africa. The necessary capital of 150,000 marks has been subscribed. The Russian Anarchist leaders Morevitch and Kavalenka have been arrested at Kiev, and Solomon Ovitch, a Jew, has been arrested for seditious practices at Kharkhoff. Sir Peter Lumsden has asked the promoters of the fund to secure for him a "sword of honor" to suspend action until his relations with the War Office are in a more settled state. Tennyson owns no house in London, but during the season the Baron hires one in Belgravia and gives select dinners to Gladstone and a very few friends, but rarely accepts invitations in return. Russia will consent to a resumption of diplomatic relations with the Vatican, provided the Pope induces the Catholic bishops of Poland to relinquish the idea of re-establishing the Nationalists of Poland. 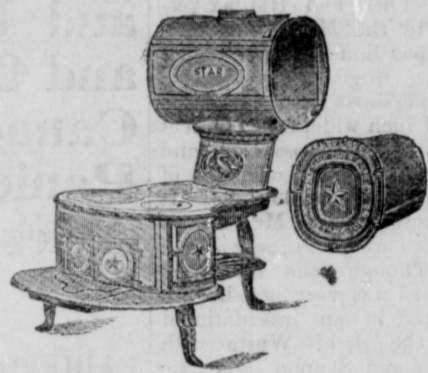
