The U.P.E.I. men's rugby team successfully opened their 1993 season with a strong 15 to 5 win over the U.N.B. Ironmen this past Saturday. The Panthers were led by third year veteran Craig Hanlon and the speedy rookie Ian Johnson, each of whom recorded tries this weekend. Mike Connolly, a former soccer panther, put his skills to good use

kicking a conversion and a penalty. Donald Beezer scored the lone try for the Ironmen.

The win marks a prosperous transition for the club to the newly formed New Brunswick Universities Rugby League. Coaches Rod MacDonald and Ed MacDonald foresee a bright future for the Panthers in the new league due to the addition of several key players from various

maritime clubs, including the P.E.I. Canada Games Squad. The Panthers will be travelling to Mt. Allison for the second game of their season as they will meet the Mounties on Saturday, September 25 as part of the annual homecoming celebration.
