## 'Copters Provide Fast Service

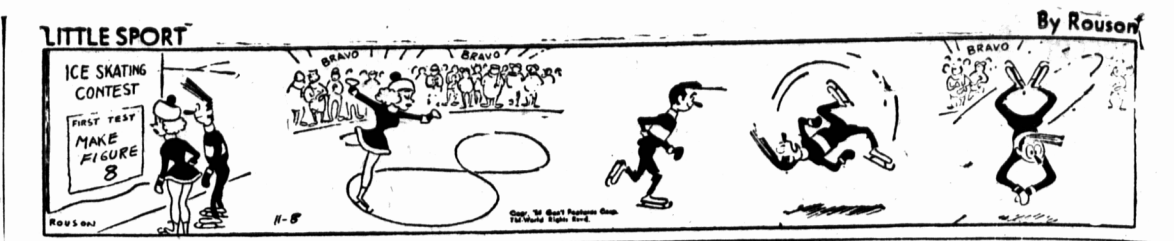

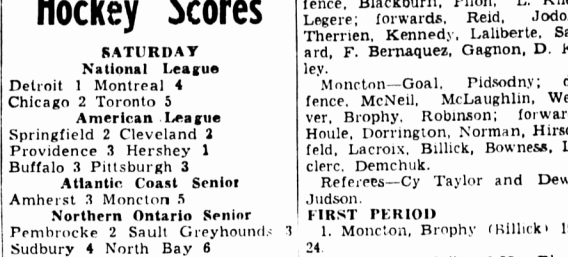

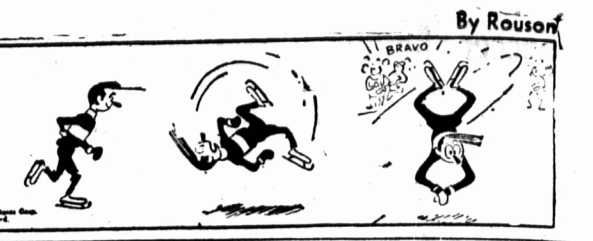
## Canada Extends Diplomatic Service

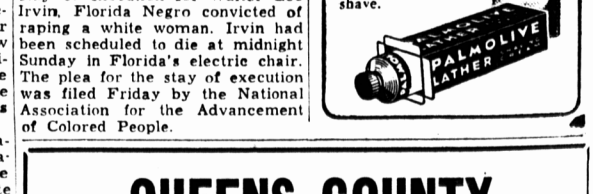
