

Latest News Notes.

The ex-Viceroy of India, Lord Lytton and wife, have sailed for England. Engineer Chiarini, who formed a part of the expedition into Central Africa is reported dead.

A German gunboat has been ordered to the Syrian coast to protect German settlers at Haifa.

In consequence of the recent murders and outrages in Ireland there is talk of a renewal of the peace preservation act.

Lady Burdett-Coutes has now enjoyed her huge fortune for forty-two years, during which time her benefactions have been over a million sterling.

Prince Bismarck has entirely given up smoking, the doctor having pronounced tobacco an impediment to a cure of his nerves.

There are three thousand Albanians posted at the most suitable spots to prevent thecession of Dulcigno. Every position of advantage forming a continuous line from the Adriatic coast to the shores of the Lake are occupied by Albanians.

The London Standard says: "We understand that the Bishop of London has notified Rev. Alexander Mackonockie, of St. Alban's Church, Holborn, that he has determined to enforce the sentence of excommunication against him."

Blenon says in a letter: "I anticipate revisiting America at the close of my European engagements, and propose to cross directly over Niagara Falls at height of 100 feet above the cataract, and nearly 250 feet above the bed of the river. I have studied well the difficulties and dangers of the attempt, and feel confident I can meet and surmount them."

News concerning the Berlin Conference produced great astonishment and indignation in official circles and among the upper ranks. The semi-official *Valky* says the conference flagrantly violated the spirit of the Berlin Treaty. A rumor is confirmed that the Porte is secretly inciting Albanians to resist the Greeks, and that considerable military preparations are being made. The troops are being moved in the direction of the Greek frontier, and artillery and ammunition sent to Salonica.
