List Line Of Succession To The Throne

LONDON, Sept. 26—(AP)—The line of succession to the throne is dominated by Princess Elizabeth's young family.

The 26-year-old Princess herself is first in line for the crown on the death of her father.

Her son, Prince Charles, who will be three years old Nov. 14, is second and is followed by his little sister, Princess Anne.

The Duke of Edinburgh, Elizabeth's husband, has no place in the line of succession. If she becomes Queen, he will be prince consort.

U.S. Cheese Restrictions Pact Violation

GENEVA, Sept. 26—(AP)—The United States restrictions on the import of cheese and other dairy products through an amendment to the Defence Production Act were flatly labelled a violation of American commitments under the general agreement on tariffs and trade yesterday.

Representatives of two countries—Canada and the Netherlands—told the members of G. A. T. T. their governments were considering retaliatory measures against the United States.

Johann Melander, chairman of the contracting parties now in session here, told the delegates that the U. S. measure was "an infringement of the general agreement, but the executive branch is making efforts to have it repealed. If these efforts are not successful action will have to be considered under article 23."

Article 23 provides for action against parties nullifying or impairing the benefits of the agreement.

The acting head of the Canadian delegation, C. M. Isbister, said that "depending upon events in the next week or two, Canada is prepared to lodge a complaint at this session and to proceed with the subsequent retaliation and other steps envisaged under article 23."

Isbister said the U. S. restrictions on imports of cheese and dairy products had "far-reaching effects" on Canadian producers. He agreed that the agreement had been infringed and said it was "difficult to find any support for the contention that U. S. cheese producers were in difficulty since the market price today is above the support price."

U. S. delegation, said a bill to repeal the measure was before Congress and the Administration hoped for early action.
