OTTAWA, March 29. In the House of Commons in reply to Mr. Davies, Hon. Mr. Tupper said that the act passed some years ago, putting duty on Newfoundland fish, imported into Canada, was not put in force, there being an understanding to that effect between the Government and the officers of customs. The act was not suspended about two months ago. The customs officers were notified to pay the Act into operation, and they collected the duties.
