On the defensive end, Pat Perry, Dale Tingley, and Rick Mallard provided strong opposition to the Maulers, blocking and stealing everything within their grasp.

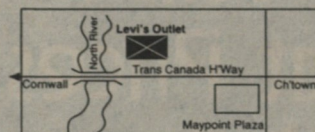
