**ELECTION**

**SHERIFF'S PROCLAMATION**

BY virtue and in pursuance of Her Majesty's Writ of Election, to me directed, tested the SECOND day of DECEMBER, now instant, and commanding me to cause to be made Public Notice and Proclamation in some of the most public places within the Polling Divisions for the First Electoral District of King's County, for all persons duly qualified by Law to vote for Members to serve in the General Assembly for the said First Electoral District of King's County, to appear before me to nominate, elect and choose, one able and discreet man for business to represent the said First Electoral District of King's County, in the Lower House of Assembly, in the place and stead of the Honorable Donald Beaton, deceased, —I do hereby give Public Notice that I will on WEDNESDAY, the 24th day of JANUARY next, at the COUNTY COURT HOUSE, in GEORGETOWN, in King's County, aforesaid, at the hour of eleven o'clock of the forenoon of the same day, open and hold a COURT for the nomination and election of one able and discreet man for business, to represent the said First Electoral District of King's County. And that in case a Poll shall on said day, at said Court, be demanded for said Election, I hereby give further notice that I will, on WEDNESDAY, the 31st day of JANUARY, next ensuing cause a Poll to be opened for the first Polling Division of the First Electoral District of King's County, at the hour of half-past nine o'clock, in the forenoon of the said last mentioned day, at or near WILLIAM COLLINS'S, Portage, on Township No. Forty-seven; and for the Second Polling Division of the said First District of King's County, I will, on the same day and hour as last aforesaid, cause a Poll to be opened at or near ANGUS CAMPBELL'S, Mill Road, Township No. Forty-five; and for the Third Polling Division of the said First Electoral District of King's County, I will on the same day and hour as last aforesaid, cause a Poll to be opened at or near MICHAEL CHRISTIAN'S, Line Road, Township No. 43, in the said County of King's County,—of which all persons duly qualified by Law to vote for one Member for the said first District of King's County, in the General Assembly of this Island, and all other persons whom the aforesaid Writ of Election doth or may concern, are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The First Polling Division shall comprise and include Township Number Forty-seven, and the Poll shall be held at or near William Collins's, Portage, on the said Township; the Second Polling Division shall comprise and include Townships Numbers Forty-five and Forty-six, and the Poll shall be held at or near Angus Campbell's, Mill Road, on Township Number Forty-five; and the Third Polling Division shall comprise and include Townships Numbers Forty-three and Forty-four, and the Poll shall be held at or near Michael Christian's, Line Road, on Township Number Forty-three.
