

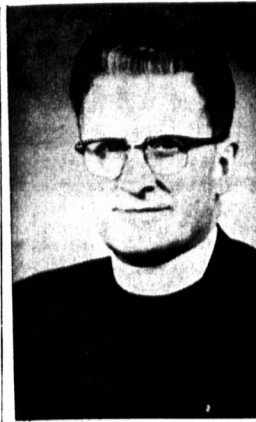


RIGOROUS TRAINING FOR PROVOST CORPS

That same year he went to St. Joseph's Seminary, Edmonton, Alberta, where he made two years in theology. He returned home in July, 1928 due to ill health but resumed his studies after a year of rest, in St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, where he was ordained, Dec. 21st, 1930, by the Most Rev. A. MacDonald, of Toronto.

His many Island friends join with those of the Archdiocese of Edmonton in wishing Father Landrigan many more years of fruitful labor in the Service of the Divine Master. Father Landrigan is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Mathias Landrigan of Sturgeon and William P. Landrigan, Sturgeon and of Clem who resides in New York. Fewer Taxes Under New Bylaw

A total of forty-two taxis are now licensed under the new by-law. Chief of Police C.W. MacArthur stated yesterday afternoon. Pre-1 indications are that this number may be increased by about another six to twelve. This will mean a substantial decrease from the 76 which were licensed in 1955. The by-law provides that all operator-owners carry insurance to the amount of \$20,000 covering injury to two or more persons; \$10,000 for injury to one and \$2,000 for property damage. To be issued an operators licence applicants must not have had a court conviction within the past three years and have all civic taxes paid in full. Since the new law went into effect several citizens have been heard to complain regarding the increased delay in obtaining a taxi at various periods during the day. In some cases where the person required a vehicle to keep an appointment, other means of transportation have had to be obtained.

Only One Plate On Manitoba Cars

WINNIPEG (CP) — Manitoba motorists no longer need to have front licence plates. In fact, those who keep them on will be liable for prosecution. An order-in-council passed May 17 says that all vehicles except motorcycles, high-speed tractors and semi-trailer trucks, shall carry only one licence plate—the rear one. The order effective May 22, was not publicized until the registrar of motor vehicles, R. B. Baillie, returned Monday from a United States automobile convention. Mr. Baillie also revealed the province likely will adopt a permanent licence plate next year, replacing the validation strip system.
