

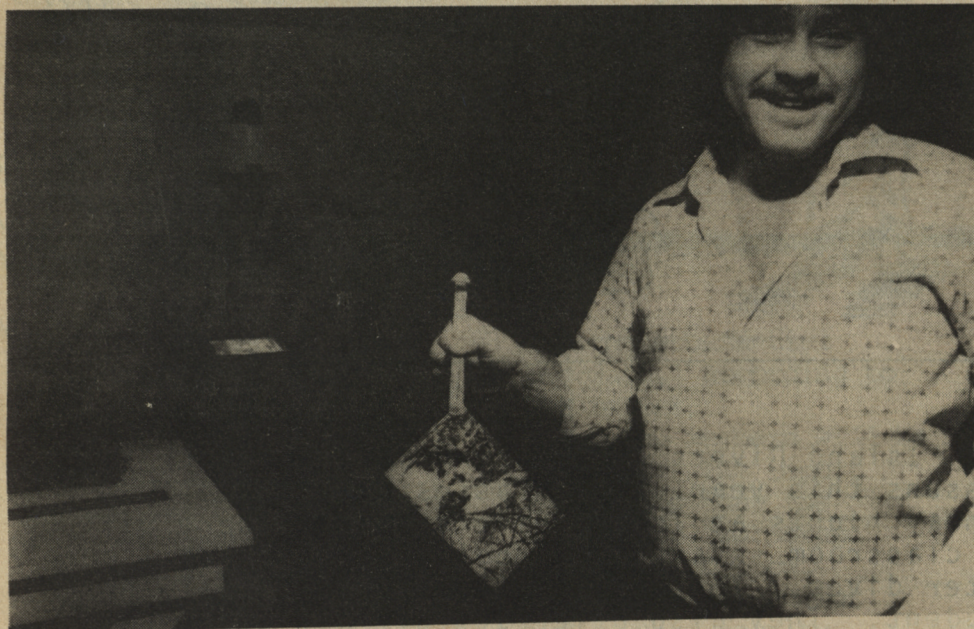

The new darkroom for the U.P.E.I. Photo Club, situated on the fourth floor Main in the media wing, is now open and operating on a partial basis.

The actual construction began during March Break of last year, using materials left over from Sun renovations and those found through diligent scrounging around the campus. A lot of time was sacrificed and much effort was contributed towards the building of the darkroom. Various jobs included: building tables, sewing and hanging special curtains, installing sinks and a film drying cabinet.

The only thing left to

be done is the plumbing and electrical hook-ups. There is a problem with plumbing, as mentioned by Jean McCabe, of the maintenance department, in trying to find a suitable means for the waste run-off to comply with plumbing regulations

As the maintenance department is very busy, it is hopeful that they will be able to solve the problem in the near future.

The new darkroom has a double door system made of darkened curtains so people entering and leaving will not interfere with the development of prints. Up to five enlargers will be able to be in use in the new area.

J.W. Dafoe Graduate Fellowship \$5,000.00

The fellowship will be open to graduates of any recognized University who possess the Honours B.A. degree or its equivalent and who intend to work for a higher degree in the field of international studies. The fellowship will be tenable in the departments of Political Studies, Economics, or History.

Applications for the year 1979-80 should be made by letter addressed to the Awards Office. The University of Manitoba, Winnipeg, Canada. Full details of the candidate's academic record should accompany his letter of application. The letter should also include information on the following points:

- (a) Age
- (b) Place of birth
- (c) Citizenship, or status of visa (student landed immigrant)
- (d) Marital status
- (e) Any previous experience other than academic.
- (f) Field of study candidate would be most interested in, and why
- (g) Any other matter candidate considers relevant.

Each candidate should also give the names and addresses of four referees who are prepared to support his application, and he should ask these referees to send their supporting letters to the Awards Office.

All applications and supporting letters should reach the Awards Office not later than JANUARY 19, 1979.

The Raymond Crepault Memorial Scholarship

Eligible are French speaking Canadian citizens interested in improving their radio and/or television skills through University training, or the equivalent, on a full-time basis, at a Canadian institution.

Candidates should meet one or more of these requirements:

- University graduation in any discipline (1st degree)
- University graduation, or current studies in communication, including journalism (1st degree).
- Graduation in broadcasting technology from a recognized institute, or the equivalent.
- Current employment in broadcasting and wishing to complete training in the field.
