## Local and Other Items.

**PAY THE PIPER.**—The mayor of Sydney has called a public meeting of the ratepayers of that place to vote \$650 to provide for unpaid liabilities of the late carnival.

**AMERICANS WIN.**—The International cricket match between the United States and Canada was finished at Toronto last week, the visitors winning by 133 runs. There was lively interest shown by the spectators, and the closeness of the game caused much excitement.

**KIPLING BOYCOTTED.**—Rudyard Kipling has been boycotted by the Sunday School of the first Methodist Church, Crawfordsville, Ind. The Sunday School purchased a number of new books for its library from the Methodist publishers of Cincinnati, and as these books came from what was regarded as the fountain head of pure literature little attention was paid to several volumes thrown in for good measure. Among these was Kipling's "Drums of Fore and Aft," which finally came into the family of a man who declared it was "fairly reeking with profanity and most outrageous slang." Fortifying himself with numerous quotations, he went before the Sunday School authorities and as a result the book was thrown out of the library.

**MORE BROKEN PROMISES.**—Sir Wilfrid Laurier promised that if his party came into power the annual expenditure would be reduced at least \$2,000,000. Mr. Mills said it would be reduced at least \$4,000,000. Sir Richard declared the spending of \$39,000,000 a monstrous thing, and claimed in loud tones that a change of Government would effect an annual saving of at least \$5,000,000 or \$6,000,000. Well, the change came and how have these economists (?) kept their word? In 1897, the first year of Laurier's administration, the government spent \$42,000,000 in 1898, \$45,000,000 in 1899 \$50,000,000 and for next year parliament has voted upwards of \$60,000,000! At this rate it will not be long before Canada will be deep in debt as some of the overburdened European powers.

**No Mormonism in Theirs.**  
PINEVILLE, Ky., Aug 11.—Four Mormon elders, after preaching here for several days, have been forced to leave by angry citizens. In Wise County Mormon elders were warned to leave, but did not. Several citizens then went to the place where they slept with a bundle of switches took the elders out and gave them a severe whipping.

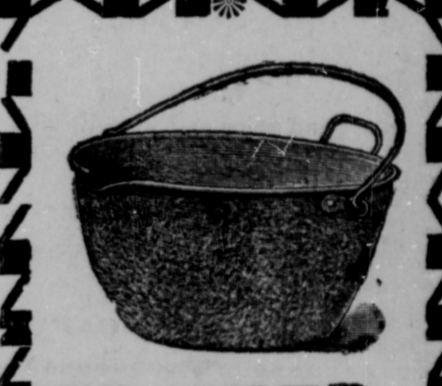
