Here are some upcoming award opportunities:

Terry Fox Humanitarian Award Program

A. Open

B. the awards will be of particular interest to graduating secondary level student and those currently studying towards a first degree or diploma in a Canadian university or college. Scholarship candidates must be Canadian citizens or have applied for citizenship at the time of award consideration. Selection criteria for recipients will be based on demonstration of the highest ideals and qualities of citizenship and humanitarian service while in pursuit of excellence in their academic, amateur sport, fitness, health, community service, and related endeavours.

C. The value of each award is \$3000.00 annually, for a maximum of four years or until a first degree is obtained.

Pillsbury Undergraduate Scholarship Program:

The purpose of the Pillsbury Undergraduate Scholarship Program is to encourage scholastic achievement and development in areas which are of primary concern to Pillsbury Canada Limited. Two awards of \$1250.00 will be awarded to students of **Business/Commerce** and two awards of \$1250.00 will also be given to students of **Food Sciences and Agricultural Science**. This program is open to all faculties of Business/Food Science/Agricultural Science at Canadian Universities. Four university scholarships are awarded annually.

Eligibility is limited to students who have completed their second full year of study towards their undergraduate year. Evaluation will be based on the student's academic transcripts as well as participation in extra-curricular activities. Completed applications are to be sent directly to the Scholarship Selection Committee not later than Nov. 30.

Orville Erikson Memorial Scholarship Fund

The fund consists of a 5-member board of trustees. The Board is responsible for the selection of candidates who will receive scholarship in any given year. The Canadian Wildlife Foundation receives, collects, and distributes applications to the OEMSF Trustees. The Trustees evaluate application and submit their list of application warranting support. All scholarships cover a regular academic year. Each scholarship is divided into two equal parts. One unit is issued in September; the other, in January. Application may be made for a summer or other sessions.

A. Conservation

B. All applicants must be competent, full-time students registered in a recognized Canadian educational institute and be citizens of Canada, or landed immigrants, with the intent of working in Canada. All applicants must be in need of financial assistance to pursue their course of study.

C. Up to \$3000.00 value

D. Scholarship applications may be submitted at any time throughout the year. Trustees will evaluate applications in June and December.

The McEuen Undergraduate Scholarship for Study in Scotland

A. Open to disciplines available at the University of St. Andrews, St. Andrews, Scotland.

B. The McEuen Scholarship is awarded annually in memory of Dr. Charles Stuart McEuen to a Canadian student resident in Canada who is of Scottish ancestry, or is the son or daughter of an alumnus of the University of St. Andrews. The Scholarship is tenable for a three-year course of studies toward an ordinary degree or a four-year course toward an honours degree. It is renewable from year to year on the basis of satisfactory performance. Applicants must not be more than 21 years of age and must be attending university in Canada or be qualified for admission into a university in Canada. The winner is chosen on the basis of outstanding academic achievement and leadership potential.

C. The scholarship covers all tuition fees and residence costs and a stipend for basic expenses.
