"If she should happen to go astray through the night" we overheard Mack say when the parting drew Gage off along the fields toward home. "I'll phone you first thing in the morning."

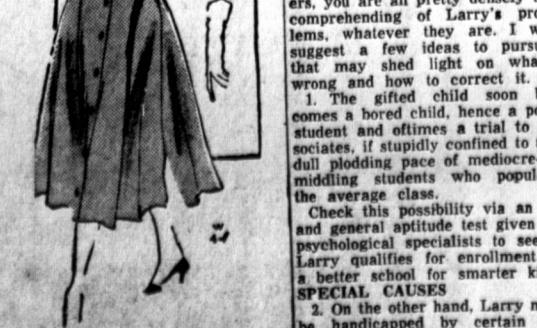
"And I'll come," Gage promised kindly "and we'll see what we can do to better her."

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THE EXPERTS SAY Women's Organizations Interested In Road Safety

OTTAWA (CP) — Women's groups across Canada are rushing to add road safety activities to club programs, say experts at the Canadian Highway Safety conference here.

W. Arch Bryce, conference general manager, says respondents with "remarkable enthusiasm" to a traffic safety competition sponsored by an oil company (Shell) and administered by the conference.

Called the Carol Lane awards, in honor of the oil firm's women's travel director in the United States, competition prizes will be awarded for the first time in 1958.

Rules for the competition, available from conference offices at 272 Somerset Street West, Ottawa, are strict. But three awards valued from \$250 to \$1,000, and the work is vital.

EFFECTIVE PROJECTS
Opened to any Canadian women's organization, the awards will be made on the basis of effective safety projects such as driver education and training, bicycle safety, pre-school safety education or pedestrian safety.

Women's groups are recognized as a "powerful force in social reform," says Mr. Bryce. It is hoped the awards will act both as rewards and incentives for greater activity toward traffic safety.

"Basically, the individual — either pedestrian or driver — is the only one who can do anything about traffic safety."

Safety education must start at the kiddy-cart stage and continue through the bicycle and car stages.

Traffic safety officials have estimated that more than 3,000 men, women and children will die this year in highway and street accidents in Canada.

The conference offers an even more ominous estimate—that 75,000 Canadians will die on streets and highways in the decade ending in 1967 if the present rate of traffic deaths continues.

BRAN MUFFINS

World's Cheapest Stores Are Found In Hong Kong
HONG KONG (Reuters)—A government-supported drive is being launched here this spring to draw more tourists to this picturesque, up-to-date British colony with the world's cheapest stores.

Tourists, mainly Americans, already are spending about \$29,000,000 a year in Hong Kong. Few ever regret the money they pass over store counters. They leave here either triumphant at having bought so much for so little, or annoyed because they have not bought more.

Hardly anywhere else in the world can luxuries be had so cheaply. For Hong Kong, with most of its natural resources of its own, has to live as a great market centre, serving the Far East by passing goods from one country to another and processing some of them as they go through. Heavy taxation would ruin this trade.

Customs duties and other taxes therefore are exceptionally light. As a result the woman tourist often leaves here with Japanese pearls, a gold Swiss wristwatch, a German camera and English woollens, all cheaper than in their country of origin and possibly one-half of one-third the price in North America.

The stores here also display stocks of beautiful Oriental ware, much of it manufactured in the colony. Jade, leatherware, cloisonné vases, embroidery, table linen, silks and camphor-wood chests leave Hong Kong every day in the personal luggage of tourists.

Canadian May Get Seat On U. N. Commission On Women
OTTAWA (CP) — Canada next year may have its first seat on the United Nations' commission on the status of women.

An external affairs department spokesman said today Canada's success as a candidate for the 18-member, all-women commission would probably be known at the end of this month when the Economic and Social Council votes on commission membership.

The commission, which finished its annual three-weeks meeting earlier this month, was established under the council in 1946. Canada has not yet had an official delegate.

Kathleen Bowly of Ottawa, national secretary of the United Nations Association has been mentioned among women's groups here as a possible commission delegate.

Miss Bowly spent three months in New York earlier this year as a special adviser to Canada's delegation to the UN General Assembly.
