THE ASSASSIAN IN MEXICO.

Attempt on the Life of President Diaz.

Would-be Murderer Arrested.

MEXICO, Sept. 17.—An attack was made on President Diaz yesterday. As he was proceeding from the Palace to the Alameda to distribute medals to the survivors of the war, a man jumped from the crowd with a long pinard in his hand and made an attempt to stab the President. But he was unsuccessful and was arrested on the spot. The excitement here is intense.

THE OPERATIONS IN INDIA.

Loss of British Officers.

SIMLA, Sept. 17.—The British loss in the Amara operations, including that of the garrison of Saragari is 36 men killed and 59 wounded. The large number of casualties among the officers is due to the fact of the men being entrenched while the officers moved about uncovered.

A GRUESOME DISCOVERY.

Dead Body of a Man in a Cargo of Grain.

GLASGOW, Sept. 17.—While stevedores were discharging the steamer Towerhill last evening they discovered the body of a young man buried in the grain aboard of her. It is supposed that the man was carried into the hold from the grain elevator in New York.

International Cricket.

OTTAWA, Sept. 17.—A cricket match between Ottawa and Boston was won by the latter by fourteen runs.

On account of the continuation of unruly conduct of prisoners in St. Vincent De Paul Penitentiary, a sergeant and six of the Dominion police have been sent there.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

OTTAWA, Sept. 15.—The department of marine has received a report from Captain Lavoie, of the fishery protection service, in which he states that reports of failures of the fishery on Labrador do not apply to the Canadian coast. His statistics on the Canadian Labrador show that the season has been exceptionally favorable and not only is there no distress, but fishermen are in prosperous condition.

MADRID, Sept. 14.—Senator Sagasta, the liberal leader, in an interview on the subject of the Cuban insurrection, says the rising instead of dying out, is spreading considerably. He adds, that the situation in the Philippine islands is serious, and asserts that the Carliste propaganda in Spain cannot be viewed with indifference. and, also, expressed the belief that a reconciliation between the political parties in Spain is impossible so long as the Conservatives are in power. In conclusion, Senator Sagasta remarks: "In my opinion the cortes will not meet; but if they do not meet, their existence is ephemeral." The liberal leader refused to express himself in regard to the relations between the United States and Spain. The official Gazette today announces that all vessels arriving in Spain from ports between New Orleans, La., and Ocean Springs, Mass., will be subject to quarantine, on account of yellow fever being prevalent.
