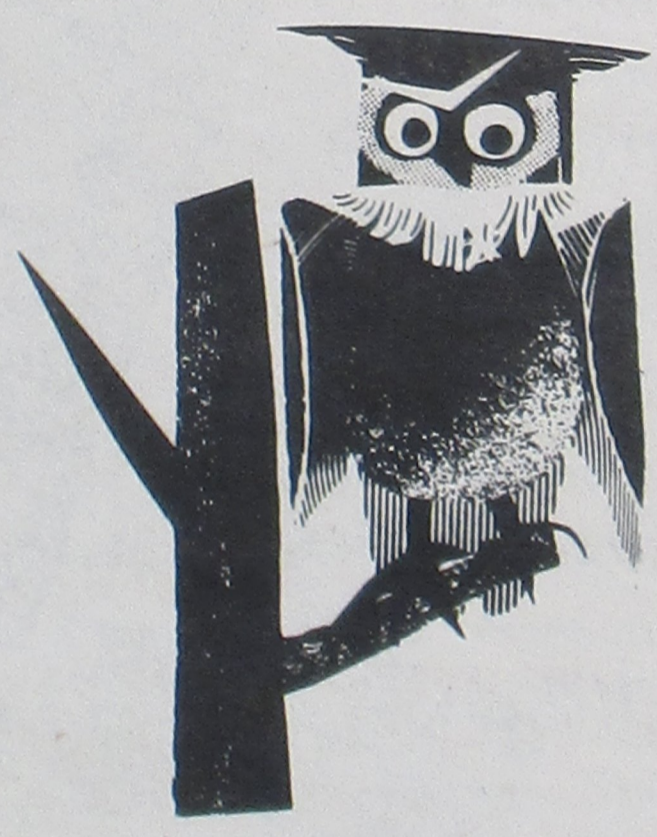
Dear Miss X:
