On motion of Hon. Mr. Anderson it was resolved, that Theophilus Stewart, Esq., Commissioner for Indian affairs, be heard at the Bar of this House, in support of certain petitions praying for aid to enable the Indians to cultivate the soil.

Mr. Stewart was then admitted and heard at considerable length.

Hon. Mr. Haszard presented a petition of certain inhabitants of Lot 48 and others having an interest in Fullerton's Marsh, praying for an Act to permit them to erect a dyke to prevent the water from overflowing the said marsh. Ordered that the said petition do lie on the table.

House adjourned for one hour.
