Facts and Figures.

At present about 10,000 persons are exiled to Siberia annually, and about 60 per cent. are nobles.

In France there are 2,150 lady artists, of whom 602 are oil painters, 107 sculptors, 193 miniature painters, and 754 painters on porcelain.

Russia produces annually about \$4,000,000 worth of honey, or over 18,000 tons, besides 5,000 lbs. of wax, worth \$2,000,000. It is nearly all consumed to the empire however.

There are said to have been 500,000 Christians in the world at the end of the first century, 10,000,000 in the time of Constantine, 30,000,000 in the eighth century, 100,000,000 at the time of the Reformation and 450,000,000 in 1883.

The imports of wool in the United States have increased since 1876 about 75 per cent., amounting now to 290,000,000 lbs. annually.

In New York city, according to some figures recently published, there are more than 800 raff dealers, and the pickers, who are mostly Italians gather \$750,000 worth yearly in the streets and roads, while the money realized for cotton rags alone in the United States is put at \$22,000,000 per annum.

England's Throne.

The throne of England, so splendid when covered with silk velvet and gold, is in fact, only an "old oak chair," over eight hundred years in use for the same purpose. Its existence has been traced back to the days of Edward. The wood is very hard and solid. The back and sides were formerly in various colors and the seat is made of rough-looking sandstone 26 inches in length, 17 in breadth and 19 1/2 in thickness, and in this stone lies the grand peculiarity of the chair. Numberless legends are told in connection with it, the truth probably being that it was originally taken from Ireland to Scotland and served at the coronation of the early Scottish kings.
