CANADIAN.

YARMOUTH, N. S., Aug. 22.

The sessions of the Baptist Convention lasted all day, yesterday, and were brought to a close a little after midnight.

The women's mission aid society's annual meeting was also held and the attendance of ladies interested was very large.

The reports on convention of the educational ministers' endowment Home, missions, and Acadia College, were read and adopted.

The educational meeting was highly interesting. Revs. Drs. Sawyer, Armstrong, DeBlois, Weldon, Bill and Day, and Revs. Saunders, Warren and others, made capital addresses upon the demand of the hour in reference to Baptist educational institutions.

The evening session, until adjournment, was engaged in rapidly passing through business. A resolution passed to petition the Canadian Parliament to preserve, at all hazards, the prohibition feature of the Scott Act, and to further temperance legislation to absolute prohibition.

The following resolution was adopted by a rising vote and ordered to be telegraphed to Secretary Blaine:

The Baptist Convention of the Maritime Provinces, now in session at Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, offer united prayer to Almighty God for the life and restoration to health of President Garfield, and beg to present to Secretary Blaine their expression of profound regret in view of the circumstances of immediate danger which now threaten the President.

After votes of thanks to the people of Yarmouth, to the railway and steamboat lines, etc., had been passed, the convention adjourned, to next meet in annual session in Leinster Street Church, St. John, N. B.

FREDERICTON, Aug. 24.

Several mining licenses in Restigouche and Gloucester Counties were sold at the Crown Land Office, to-day. Two square miles in Restigouche were sold to Adams & Saddle at \$20 and \$25 respectively.

A quarrel between ex-Sheriff Blanton and James Todd was settled, yesterday, by Blanton's head being shot off and Todd shot through the heart, both dying together.

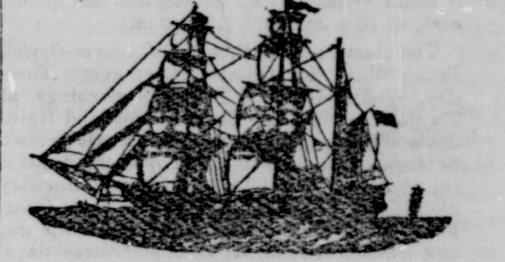
